

## Traditional Chinese Medicine Massage (An Mo Tui Na) – nib Provider Recognition Criteria

To apply for provider recognition with nib, please contact your professional association.

Please note: Student Membership is not accepted.

**nib may grant provider recognition to providers who meet the criteria below. This recognition may be granted at nib's absolute discretion and meeting the criteria does not guarantee recognition.**

For recognition by nib for the purposes of benefit payment for Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) Massage (Tui Na) services, the provider must fulfil the following criteria:

- Hold a Diploma Qualification in TCM massage at Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) level 5 or above, completed at an Australian Registered Training Organisation.

The following courses meet these minimum requirements:

- HLT52115 Diploma of Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) Remedial Massage
  - HLT50112 Diploma of Traditional Chinese Medicine Massage (An Mo Tui Na)
  - HLT50107 Diploma of Traditional Chinese Medicine Massage (An Mo Tui Na)
  - HLT50102 Diploma of Traditional Chinese Medicine Massage (An Mo Tui Na)
- Any overseas qualifications must be independently assessed and validated by an Australian Registered Training Organisation for determination of recognition of prior learning or equivalency.
  - Any qualifications (whether Australian or Overseas) pertaining to courses that have been largely delivered by distance education or online are not accepted.
  - Operate in Private Practice – definition from nib's Provider Terms and Conditions – **"Private Practice** means a professional practice (sole, partnership or group) that is self-supporting primarily through fees received from patients. This means that the practice's expenses (e.g. accommodation, facilities and services) are not provided or subsidised by any publicly funded facility such as a public hospital or a university."
  - Professional Indemnity and Public Liability Insurance - current insurance policy covering each practice address recognised at a minimum level of \$2 million for professional indemnity insurance per claim and \$10,000,000 public liability per claim;
  - A current Senior First Aid certificate such as Provide First Aid certificate HLTAID011, (HLTAID003 previously - still valid for 3 years from 2020);
  - Continuing Professional Development at a level at or above the minimum standard required to maintain registration at the required level with the professional association with which you are registered;
  - The provider must meet and continue to meet nib's requirements set out in nib's Recognised Provider Terms and Conditions, which may be found here:
